1. **Answer:**

- (a) In Ex. 32 we have the account of the golden calf; Moses great intercession the breaking and renewal of the covenant between God and Israel.
 - (b) Some reasons why the atrocities occurred are:
 - (1) Caused by impatience. Tired of waiting for the Promised Land.
 - (2) Caused by pressure from the crowd.

16. **Answer:**

The Word of God states in very simple terms and make it explicitly clear that the nature of sin is two-fold.

- (a) There is **inward defilement** from which the acts of transgression are produced (Jer. 17:9; Mark 7:21).
- (b) There is the **act of transgression** which has its origin in the evil nature within (James 1:13-15; Gal. 5:19-21; etc.)
