

Chapter 2 Lesson 8 Answers for Review Questions

1. **Answer:**
In 1 Peter 3:1-6 Peter specifically addressed wives. (Page 2)
2. **Answer:**
Do not let outward adorning be the main practical thing, or your primary area of emphasis; do not set your heart only on external adornment. (Page 2)
3. **Answer:**
We need to pay proper attention to the internal virtue of the soul because in reality, this inner beauty will work itself out in all areas of our practical lives. (Page 3)
4. **Answer:**
The three ornaments forbidden as noted in 1 Peter 3:3-4 are (a) Platting of the Hair (b) Wearing of Gold and (c) Putting on of Apparel. (Pages 4-5)
5. **Answer:**
Based on the historical setting and practices of the time Peter wrote these instructions (1 Peter 3:1-6), the caution in these verses is to avoid adapting to the practices of the corrupt environment. (Page 4)
6. **Answer:**
In general “apparel” refers to cloke (“cloke” is an old KJV usage, example Matt. 5:40; Luke 6:29; ... it is the same as “cloak”), referring to clothes, garment, raiment, robe, vesture. (Page 4)

Believers should take care that all their external behavior is answerable to their professing of Christianity; they are to live consistent lives based on Christian standards and principles. (Page 5)

(b) In a day of sexual permissiveness the church should act and dress differently from a corrupt society that throws aside and ridicules the Spirit's desire for modesty, purity and godly restraint (Rom. 12:2). (Page 11)

24. Answer:

The meaning here is that the truth; the gospel was to be preached to all mankind, was a truth abounding in glory.

- (b) **The destiny planned for the saints.** We are still limited in our physical understanding and at this time will not know all that God has in store for His children (1 Cor. 2:9); however, we are not left in the dark (1 Cor. 2:10).
- (c) **The means of attaining the holy end.** Only His (Christ) indwelling and our continual communion with Him can dispel any doubt about heaven. **To have Christ is to have life!** (Rom. 8:11; Eph. 1:1-14; 1 John 5:11-13)
