5. **Answer:**
Joshua was a type of Christ in the following ways:
(a) Observed in the Greek usage: Joshua in the Greek is translated Jesus (Acts 7:45; Heb. 4:8).
(b) Joshua was divinely appointed (Num. 27:18-23); Jesus Christ was appointed Savior of men (Heb. 1:1-2; etc.)
(c) A type of Christ by the meaning. Both Joshua's' and Jesus' names have the same comprehensive meaning: Savior or Deliverer.
(d) Joshua was commander and leader of his people (Josh. 1:10-18); Jesus Christ is the Commander and Redeemer of all mankind (Heb. 2:9-18).

9. Answer:

Some characteristics of Moses are:

- (a) He was a messenger of God, both to Pharaoh and the Israelites (Ex. 5-11).
- (b) He experienced a close relationship with God (Ex. 24:9-11)
- (c) He was a man of extra ordinary humility (Num. 12:3)
- (d) He was a man of faith (Heb. 11:24)
- (e) He displayed fidelity (Heb. 11:25)
- (f) He was a man of foresight (Heb. 11:26)
- (g) He was a man of firmness (Heb. 11:27)

10. Answer:

Some examples of ways Joshua served as Moses minister are:

- (a) When Israel's army needed a leader Joshua was commissioned to be general (Ex. 17:8-9)
- (b) Joshua was there on Mt, Sinai when God presented the Ten Commandments to Moses (Ex. 24:13; 32:17).
- (c) As a young man, he was placed in charge of the Tabernacle when the idolatry of the people caused Moses to be removed from camp (Ex. 33:11)
- (d) He proved his loyalty to leadership when he thought that leadership was being threatened (Num. 11:24-29).
- (e) He was one of the twelve spies, chosen at Kadesh-barnea to evaluate and make a report on Canaan (Num. 13:8, 16). Page 5

13. Answer:

Moses representing the Law or its era passed; it was Joshua his successor who led the people to the Promise Land. Jesus Christ was born under the Law to redeem them under the Law.

 - (b) **Second Promise:** The conquest of all enemies. "There shall not any man be able to stand before thee all the days of thy life." (Josh. 1:5a)
 - (c) **Third Promise:** The continued, unbroken presence and rest of God. "As I was with Moses, so I will be with you: I will not leave you nor forsake you." (Josh. 1:5 and 9)

Three charges to be courageous made to Joshua are:

- (a) **First:** Be strong and courageous in your task; to lead the people to inherit the Promise Land (Josh. 1:6)
- (b) **Second:** God encouraged Joshua to be strong and courageous in obeying His law, His Word. Joshua was to make the Law of God his main source of regulation and guide (Josh. 1:7-8).
- (c) **Third:** God encouraged Joshua to be strong and courageous in overcoming fear and discouragement. The emphasis by God as in this situation is the remedy for fear. (Josh. 1:9).
