(b) (b) The Israelites waited for centuries - - in fact - - for all their lives (i.e. these Israelites who were the first Israelite occupants) to possess the Promised Land. For more information see Pages 1, 4-7; also Lesson 11 example Pages 3-4, 12-13.
9. **Answer:**
(a) The land was guaranteed to them by God: Gen. 15:18; 17:8; Ex. 6:8; Lev. 20:24; Num. 14:8; Josh 1;1-9; etc. **Also note carefully Num. 33:53.**
(b) The land was conquered not to remain idle but to be occupied by the Israelites. For more information see Pages 6-7
10. **Answer:**
God had pre-ordained that Joshua and Eleazar would be in charge of the distribution of lots in Canaan; they would be assisted by the tribal princes chosen by God (Num. 34:16-29; Josh. 14:1). Page 7
11. **Answer:**
(a) The garment of the priest included a breastplate, an ephod, a robe, a woven tunic, a turban and a sash (Ex. 28:4_43).
(b) The **“main duty”** of the priests was to maintain a proper relationship with God. This was done by caring for the tabernacle and administering the law (example Num. 18).
12. **Answer:**
(a) Eleazar is the third son of Aaron and Elisheba (Ex. 6:23) ; his name means “God has helped”. He became the second, High Priest, succeeding his father Aaron after he died (Num. 20:23-29).

13. **Answer:**
(a) The **Ephod** was part of the ceremonial dress of the High Priest and upon which the breastplate containing the Urim and Thummim rested.
(b) The **Urim** and **Thummim** were two sacred onyx stones, used to give an affirmative or negative response to “inquiry of God”.
(c) The priest wore a **breastplate** containing 12 semi-precious stones upon which were engraved the names of the 12 tribes of Israel; this was worn over the ephod. The Urim and Thummim were carried in the breastplate (Ex. 28:30; etc.).
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14. Answer:

- (a) They were made aware of a power in life that was higher than material gains.
- (b) They referred themselves to God, and to His wisdom and sovereignty, trusting Him capable above all else to determine what was best for them.

16. Answer:

- (a) The Levites were not given an inheritance as the other tribes distinguished and dignified them because it was required that they retain their distinctiveness as **servants of God**. They were to remain free in order to effectively minister as required.
- (b) The Levites were specially chosen, set apart to the service of God.
- (c) The scattering of the Levites throughout the tribes enabled them to minister spiritual benefits to the whole nation.

Caleb was not of a designated tribe of Israel but he received a **personal inheritance** because of his faith and loyalty to God. This inheritance was personally promised by God (Num. 14:24; etc.)

25. Answer:

(a) Hebron was also called the city of “Arba”; **“Arba”** was regarded as the greatest man among the Anakims (Josh. 14:15). Arba was the founder of Hebron to which he gave its ancient name “Arba” (Josh. 15:13; 21:11).

(b) The city was also referred to as “Kirjath-Arba”; it was here Sarah died and Abraham purchased a burial ground where she and other patriarchs, Abraham, Isaac, etc. were buried (Gen. 23:1-2; etc.)
