1. Answer:

We have in Psalm 1 a most powerful illustration of permanence noted in the example of the flourishing tree planted by the rivers of water. The righteous is like a well-established tree securely settled in fertile soil. For more information, see Pages 1-2.

2. Answer:

- (a) On that day fear shall lay hold on the ungodly.
- (b) Although when sinning they were confident and fearless, now they will desire to flee away.

3. Answer:

(a) The "royal" or "Messianic" psalms are prophetic and foretell of the coming "Messiah" or the "Anointed One."

4. Answer:

The LORD'S response to why the ills of the world seem to prevail . . . the answer is not found by looking around at the world, but by looking to the fulfillment of God's divine plan for the human race. Page 4

5. Answer:

- (a) In Vv. 1-3, the psalmist is the speaker and he views the revolt of the nations against the LORD and His Anointed.
- (b) In Vv. 4-6, God, the Father, is the speaker and He declares that He has set, His King upon His holy hill of Zion.

6. Answer:

Satan knows for certain that as the Messiah's, the Anointed One's, kingdom rises and gains ground, all his efforts are in jeopardy and he will do anything and everything to oppose and destroy God's work here on earth but his opposition is futile. Page 5

- (b) "Heathen" was used in reference to the surrounding nations or to all other people who were not Jews . . . those who did not recognize and worship the LORD.

8. Answer:

- (a) **"Imagine"** (Psalm 2:1) mean the people **"meditate"**; the same word in the Hebrew is used in Psa. 1:2, but here with the implication of plotting evil.
- (b) Their minds were engaged in deliberating on their plot . . . that is, they continuously focused on their plan to oppose God.

- (a) The psalmist sees a general commotion in the planning process among the nations.
- (b) In verse 2, he describes specifically the reason for the turmoil . . . putting their plans in place to rebel.

- (a) The organizers of the rebellion were the leaders of the nations.
- (b) In reality, these forces do not usually agree but in this situation, they forgot all their differences and indifferences in order to unite in fighting against God and His anointed. Pages 7-8

- (a) The Anointed in Psa. 2:2 refers to the Messiah.
- (b) Anointed is derived from the Hebrew "Mashiach" or "Messiah".

14. Answer:

- (a) It was a most spiteful and malicious opposition. At the setting up of Christ's kingdom they rage and fret; they gnashed their teeth in frustration.
- (b) It was deliberate and militant opposition. They imagine (or meditate), deliberate and continuously focused on their goal to oppose God and His Anointed.

15. Answer:

The solution for victory over a rebellious life against God:

- (a) Choose the pathway of God's righteousness according to His Word (Deut. 30:15, 19; Josh. 24:15).

- (a) "He shall laugh" this fact conveys to our minds that irrespective of the greatest confederacies and kings and people and their most extensive and vigorous preparations to defeat God's purposes and injure His people all their efforts are insufficient and worthless.
- (b) God laughs but it is a scornful laugh! It is a laugh with vengeance! Etc.

- (a) **"Yet"** (2:6) is translated **"and".** The message conveyed here is: **"And** I have set or establish my King."
- (b) **"Set"** (2:6) means **to pour out**, as in making a tribute to Deity. <u>Pour out</u> is also used in reference to <u>"pour out oil</u> as in anointing of a king or priest.
- (c) Jesus Christ was appointed and anointed by the Father.

20. Answer:

The Anointed One is Himself introduced as declaring the great purpose which was formed in regards to Him and referring to the promise which was made to Him as the foundation of the purpose of the LORD to set Him on the hill of Zion. For more information, see Pages 17-19.

- (a) Christ, the Anointed One, was regarded and acknowledged as God's Son, or have that rank and status (2:7).
