The words "*hearts*" and "*reins*" remind us that God knows everything and that includes the very thoughts of man (1 Sam. 16:7; Psa. 94:9; 139:1-2, 23-24; Jer. 17:10). In essence we are hereby talking about the "omniscience of God."
