1. **Answer:**

- (a) *Students answers will vary . . . they should stay within context.*
- (b) (Brief example): It shows the effect of sin, as noted by Christ, for example Luke 21:26. The adverse situations are related to stress which leads to so many physical problems. Etc.

- (a) The discourse that commences at John 13:31 has been referred to as “**Christ Farewell Discourse**” or the “**Upper Room Discourse.**” It is found in **John 13:31-17.**
- (b) The discourse was presented at the Last Supper and possible continued on their way to the Mount of Olives (they also went to the Garden of Gethsemane (Matt. 26:36-46). Many scholars refer to this discourse as the most beautiful, because it is so tender and full of much thoughts beneficial to produce comfort and assurance.
