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5. Answer:

Spurgeon noted that there is "no other psalm like Psalm 22 because of its accurate prophetical references of Christ's crucifixion . . . for example:

- (a) Psa. 22:1: was fulfilled as recorded in Matt. 27:46.
- (b) Psa. 22:6: was fulfilled as recorded in Matt. 27:39-44.

(c) Etc.

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6. Answer:

Two very important factors noted in Psa. 22:1 are:

(a) The forsaken person had a genuine personal relationship with God. <u>Although he was</u> experiencing persecution of men his complaint was not against God.

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(b) <u>The repetition of the petition reveals the severity of the suffering he was</u> <u>experiencing.</u>

7. Answer:

As applicable to the Savior "... why have You forsaken me?" refers to those dreadful moments on the cross when forsaken by men, He seemed also to be forsaken by God. Page 8. ... For additional information see Pages 7-9.

8. Answer:

- (a) "Why": (1) What is the cause. (2) What is the end product of all this?
- (b) **"Hast thou" (KJV)** ... **"Have you" (NKJV):** You, My Father; You the Comforter of those in trouble; You who the suffering and dying look to when all else fail.
- (c) "Forsaken": You have left me to suffer alone. Etc.
- (d) "Me": Thy well-beloved Son. etc.

10. Answer:

- (a) False
- (b) To the psalmist, God seems far away. But though the psalmist had honest doubts, he did not stop praying or conclude that God no longer cared, he remained focused on God and faithfully committed!! Deciding that nothing will move him.

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11. Answer:

"You are holy" or "You are righteous and blameless." This indicates that the sufferer maintained unwavering confidence in God.
