#### 1. Answer:

(a) David was regarded as the Sweet Psalmist of Israel.

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(b) "The Sweet Psalmist of Israel": It speaks of David's holy character. He was a Psalmist, and the title contains two things (1) It speaks of a <u>Divine Poet</u> and (2) He composed <u>sacred songs and hymns</u>.

There are several other opinions but in essence they show his (David's) desire to sincerely exalt God in worship and giving God thanks for all His goodness. He was raised up (exalted) and anointed by God. (Personal Notes).

The Ark of the Covenant represented God's literal presence among His people (Ex. 20:10-25). According to Heb. 9:4, this wooden box overlaid with pure gold held the tables of the law (Ex. 25:16; 34:29), the golden manna (Ex. 16:33), and Aaron's rod that budded (Num. 17:8-11).

- (a) True worshippers keep themselves from habitual sins.

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#### 15. Answer:

- (a) "He" in Psa. 24:5a refers to the qualified worshipper.
- (b) The qualified worshipper will be endowed with blessing from *Yahweh (Jehovah)*Page 14

#### 16. Answer:

- (a) The blessed and righteous ones do more than enter into covenant with God; they also pursue Him with a continual seeking. This is something each generation must do afresh.
- (b) The phrase "to seek God": is often used as a descriptive expression of sincere devotion to God (Psa. 9:10; 63:1; Matt. 6:33; etc.).
- (c) "To seek God": indicates an earnest desire to know Him and to obtain His favor. It also indicates humility of mind, and sense of dependence on God.

#### 17. Answer:

Brief description of the three sections of Psalm 24.

- (a) **The first section Vv. 1-2:** glorifies the True and Living God and sings of His universal domain and dominion.
- (b) **The second section Vv. 3-6:** describes the true Israel who are able to commune with Him; showing how one can enter into relationship with this great God.
- (c) **The third section Vv. 7-10:** pictures the ascent of the true Redeemer who opened heaven's gate for the entrance of His elect. One scholar also notes that it shows the welcome of God unto His people by opening the "gates." Page 18

#### 18. Answer:

- (a) **The First:** "The LORD" or "Yahweh" . . . thus announcing His name . . . the Covenant Keeping God.
- (b) **The Second:** "Strong and mighty" . . . thus declaring His power and might.
- (c) **The Third**: "The LORD mighty in battle" . . . hereby declaring that He is a mighty warrior . . . . .

# 19. Answer:

The ark itself points symbolically to Christ—seen for example in the mercy-seat. The ark's entry into Jerusalem points to the ascension of Christ into heaven and the welcome given to Him there!

# 20. Answer:

- (a) "... of hosts": The word literally means: "armies" or "military hosts."
- (b) There are several usages to the term "hosts"
  - (1) Applied to angels . . . . . (1 Kings 22:9; etc.).

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- (2) Applied to stars or constellations . . . . . (Deut. 4:19; etc.)
- (3) <u>God is called</u> "<u>Jehovah of hosts</u>" <u>because He is head of all the armies of His people, as their leader and commander</u>; . . . . . . . .
