SELECTED PSALMS PHASE 1 Psalm 32 Part B Answers for Review Questions

1. Answer:

In Rom. 4:6-8, Paul authenticates the fact that Psalm 32 was written by David. **Rom. 4:6**:"... just as David also describes the blessedness of the man whom God imputes righteousness apart from works:..." Page 1

2. Answer:

"For this": is referring to: "this state of mind" or "this joyous result" or "the encouragement derived from my deliverance.

3. Answer:

Item (b) . . . may obtain forgiveness, for God changes not.

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4. Answer:

"In a time when You may be found . . ." (Psa. 32:6): The Hebrew usage conveys the thought of: "*in a time of hiding.*" The meaning is that the seeker would find his pursuit favorable, an ideal time to obtain mercy. For more information, see Page 3.

5. Answer:

- (a) "... a flood of great waters ..." (Psa. 32:6b): or in times of calamity as when water spread over a land – or in a time of judgment – when such floods sweep away everything.
- (b) An ideal illustration is that of the antediluvian world noted in Genesis 6 and 7.
- (c) In reference to the wicked, undoubtedly refers to the floods of calamity, that will be experienced by the ungodly (2 Peter 3:1-14; etc.). See Page 4

6. Answer:

- (a) False.
- (b) Psa. 32:6b, specifically states that calamities *"shall not come near him..."*, that is the believer.

The believer will be secured! He shall not be swept off with others (Psa. 91:5; 112:7; 125:1; etc.).

8. Answer:

- (a) *"Preserve"* (Psa. 32:7b): When used in reference to God means: God's preservation and maintenance of His people (Psa. 31:23; Prov. 2:8; etc.).
- (b) *"Trouble"* (Psa. 32:7b): As used in this text refers to trials of life, or could refer to God's judgment.
- (c) The child of God shall be preserved from trouble, from the sting of it, and from the stroke of it as far as it is good for him (the believer).

- (a) "sorrow" (Psa. 32:10a): It speaks of mental pain or grief, arising from the privation which results from the consequences of their continued impenitence and evil ways.
 "wicked" (Psa. 32:10a): The word indicated the guilt engendered (generated, inspired, etc.) by sinning against another including God.
- (b) "Many sorrows shall be to the wicked . . .": The meaning as used in Psa. 32:10a, is referring most likely to those who refuse to submit to God and totally rejecting the recommendation as given by the psalmist. Page 12

16. Answer:

- (a) Psa. 136 is the classic text to understand the significance of "mercy."
- (b) It is used twenty-six times, to proclaim that God's kindness, love and faithfulness which serve as the foundation for His actions and His character.
