To: My Fellow Saints and Well-Wishers Date: December 11, 2023 Re: "... You shall call His name Jesus, ..."

It is indeed a blessed opportunity allowed by God to continue serving Him as He desires. Let us continue to love one another as brothers and sisters as such is God's desire and it's all to His praise and glory!! (Psa. 133; John 13:35; etc.).

Today, I will not be presenting a summarized study as it has been in previous newsletters, instead I will (1) make some brief comments relevant to the topic introduced and (2) a poem that God laid on my heart December 5, 2023. I am asking you to focus on three references: <u>Matt. 1:18-25, NB Vv. 18-25</u>; Isa. 61, NB Vv. 1-6; Heb. 2, NB Vv. 9-13.

The Word of God is clear about the definition of marriage, and therefore the prevailing confusion among so many as to what marriage is not necessary. Similarly, so many each year celebrate Christmas and do not understand the real reason for it (**unfortunately so!!**). Christ's coming to earth need not be a confusing matter and the objectives of His earthly ministry are clearly documented in Scriptures:

- 1. In the Old Testament see: Gen. 3:15; Isa. 42:1, 4; 61, NB Vv. 1-6; Hosea 11:1; Micah 5:2; etc.
- In the New Testament we have a powerful documentation of His coming and accounts of His ministry. <u>For example, the Gospel of John presents Christ as the Son of God</u>. Note seven witnesses in John's Gospel:
 - (a) John the Baptist John 1:34.
 - (b) The Father John 5:37.
 - (c) The Old Testament's Verification John 5:39.
 - (d) Jesus Christ Himself John 8:14.
 - (e) The Holy Spirit John 15:26.
 - (f) Believers John 15:27.

"The great challenge left us is to cut through all the glitz and glam of the season that has grown increasing secular and commercial, and be reminded of the beauty of the One who is Christmas." (Bill Crowder)

The Amplified Bible translates Matt. 1:21 as follows:

"She will bear a Son, and **you shall call His name Jesus** [the Greek form of the Hebrew Joshua, which means Savior] for He shall save His people from their sins [that is prevent them from falling and missing the true end and scope of life, which is God." (Emphasis mine). Please read Matt 1:18-25, NB Vv. 21-23. Oh! That as we celebrate the coming of Christ to earth, we give Him that which He deserves and is required of us! The reality is, it is all about Him! He must be glorified in all that we do!! He must be lifted up in our praises and our **daily** lives!!

Mary's child (Matt. 1:18-25), Jesus Christ, was (is) the infinite unlimited God, who took on humanity with its limitations (John 1:14) in order to die for the salvation of all who believe on Him (John 3:16). Many today, focus only on the festivities of the season and either completely ignore Jesus Christ or place Christ as secondary, instead of giving Him the preeminence (Col. 1:15-20).

We must keep in mind that the cradle points to the cross and "The Way of the Cross Leads Home!" Can we with grateful hearts thank Christ <u>daily</u>, for securing our salvation, giving us the assurance of eternal life in His presence for eternity!!

In Matt. 1:18-25, note also that Jesus Christ fulfilled Isaiah 7:14; Jesus was God in the flesh, as a result God literally was (is) among us, **"with us"**. He was not only here for 3 ½ years but is with us in the person of the Blessed Holy Spirit (John 14:15-18; Rom. 8:2, 9-11; Matt. 28:20). And, yes, beloved, He is coming back again!! (Acts 1:9-11)!! Let us exalt Him!! Let us lift Him up!! Let us magnify Him!! Let our life-style <u>DAILY</u> live out His standards!! Christmas is about victorious living!! Victory because the Savior has come, come to seek and save those who were lost!! It is victory for the whosoever will and this victory is applicable in any area of our lives!!
