### Answers for Review Questions

1. **Answer:**

- (a) **Part A, Vv. 21-24:** we have a desperate father/leader who earnestly sought Jesus to heal his daughter.
- (b) **Part B, Vv. 25-34:** While Jesus was on His way to Jairus' home a desperate woman with a hemorrhage for twelve years was healed.
- (c) **Part C, Vv. 35-43:** Christ arriving at Jairus' home saw a chaotic situation created by the mourners but when He left there was calmness, consolation and conquest.

It was undoubtedly a life-draining situation, which means that her energy, strength, etc. were gradually fading and her physical condition becoming more and more taxing, fatiguing and hope was diminishing.

(a) Although the woman (Mark 5:25-34) touched Jesus, He did not become unclean because of His nature and the power of God. Instead, when she touched Him, she became clean.
